Highlights of GNRC

Area Agency on Aging and Disability

- The Area Agency on Aging & Disability (AAAD) continues to provide a variety of supportive and nutritional services to keep seniors and other adults with physical disability in their home and out of the more costly long term care system for as long as possible.
- The Area Agency on Aging & Disability contracts with 19 local senior centers to provide disease prevention and health and wellness activities to promote and maintain a healthy lifestyle and provide information and counseling on Medicare and other insurance related programs.
- The AAAD implemented one evidenced based fall prevention program this past fiscal and will continue to expand these types of programs in the new fiscal year.
- The AAAD now serves as the Single Point of Entry for the Choices Program, passed by the Legislature in 2008. This new program restructures the Medicaid long term care service delivery system in Tennessee and provides additional options for receiving care in the home and community.

Economic & Community Development

Since the beginning of tracking projects in 1983, GNRC has processed 316 projects totaling \$119,268,535 that benefited 288,860 persons as follows:

- Community Development Block Grants (CDBG): 112 projects for \$43,190,651 and assisted 244,699 persons.
- Community Development Block Grants/Industrial (CDBG/Ind): 13 projects for \$3,848,315
- Community Development Block Grants/Disaster: 2 projects totaling \$1,138,100 assisting 9,143 persons.
- Economic Development Administration (EDA): 14 projects for \$9,114,250 and assisting 18,795 persons
- Energy Efficiency Community Development Block Grant: 1 project totaling \$100,000 in order to assist 15,000 persons
- Federal Emergency Management Administration (FEMA): 1 project for \$13,500 assisting 310 persons.
- FastTrack Industrial Development Program (FIDP): 31 projects totaling \$21,034,749
- Local Parks and Recreation Program (CWCF/LPRF): 2 projects for \$26,000 to benefit 2,482 persons.
- Rural Development: 3 projects total \$1,343,000
- Tennessee Housing Development Agency (THDA) HOME: 43 projects totaling \$14,901,287 benefiting 494 persons
- Tennessee Industrial Infrastructure Program (TIIP) [aka FIDP]: 94 projects for \$24,558,683

Mid-Cumberland Area Development Corporation (MADC)

MADC began tracking loans in 1985 and has processed 362 loans totaling \$110,785,259 with \$195,397,533 in private investment and creating 5,903 jobs as follows:

- Capital Loan Program: 34 loans with 74 jobs for loan amounts totaling \$922,241 and private investment of \$1,270,350
- Intermediary Relending Program: 35 loans with 356 jobs for loan amounts totaling \$3,792,018 and private investment of \$3,239,750
- Revolving Loan Fund Program: 87 loans with 312 jobs for loan amounts totaling \$6,097,000 and private investment of \$10,718,297
- Small Business Administration (SBA) 504 Loan Program: 206 loans with 5,161 jobs for loan amounts totaling \$99,974,000 and private investment of \$180,169,136

Special Projects

- Completed Tennessee River Trail Association (TRTA) Corridor Management Plan as part of a Scenic Byway Gant through TDOT/GNRC for \$234,081. Nine counties participate in TRTA: Benton, Decatur, Hardin, Henry, Houston, Humphreys, Perry, Stewart and Wayne.

Greater Nashville Regional Council Formation and Purpose

The Greater Nashville Regional Council (GNRC) is the regional planning and economic development organization of the 13 counties and 53 cities of the greater Nashville region of northern Middle Tennessee. Nashville, Music City USA and the State's Capitol, is the central urban area of the region. Counties comprising the region include: Cheatham, Davidson, Dickson, Houston, Humphreys, Montgomery, Robertson, Rutherford, Stewart, Sumner, Trousdale, Williamson, and Wilson counties.

GNRC's full Board membership is made up of the mayor of each city, the mayors and county executives of each county, two members of the State Legislature, and a minority member along with an industrial representative of each county. The full Board meets annually to elect new officers, certify the Executive Committee, and approve the annual budget and work program. GNRC's Executive Committee, with representatives from each county, meets monthly in carrying out responsibilities of directing the Council's programs and services on behalf of member governments, with a professional staff of over 80 people and an annual budget of \$10.9 million.

The Council's primary mission through regional planning and cooperation is to help guide and accommodate the growth and development of the region in the most desirable, efficient and cost effective manner, and to assist in ensuring both the environmental quality and the long-term viability of the region for all citizens.

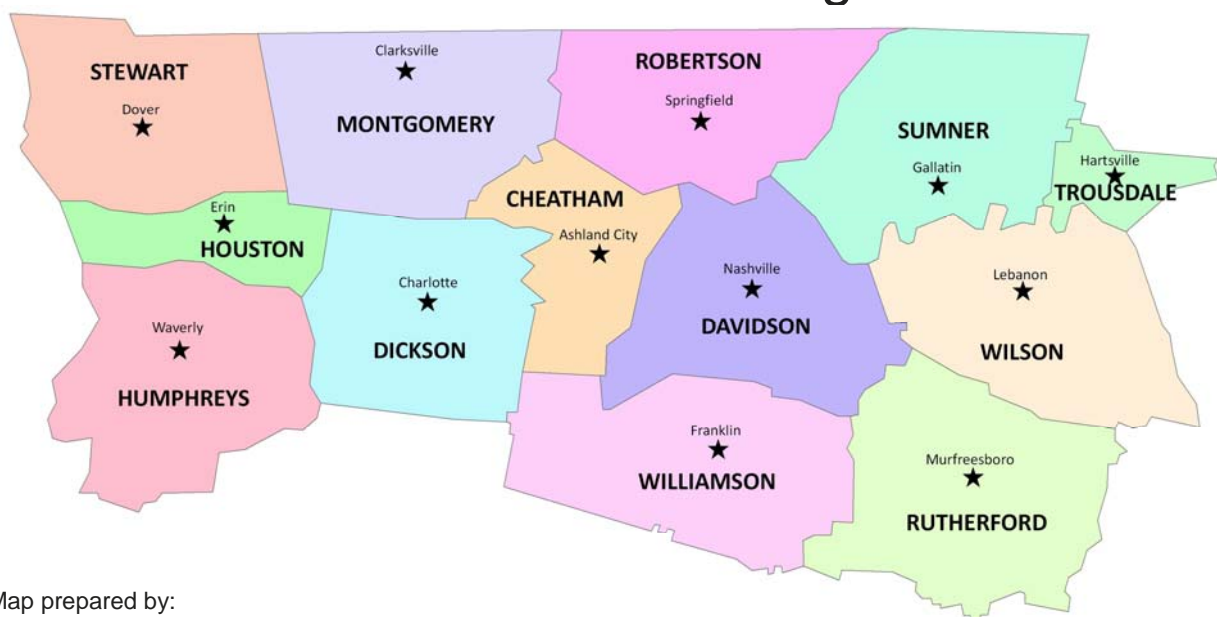

Area Agency on Aging and Disability

OVERVIEW

The Area Agency on Aging and Disability (AAAD) plans programs and services for older adults and adults with disabilities in the Greater Nashville region. The AAAD provides advocacy, coordination, inter-agency linkages, information sharing, and program evaluations. The AAAD provides a number of key services directly; other services are provided through contract with local organizations within each county.

DIRECT SERVICES PROVIDED BY THE AAAD

Single Point of Entry (SPOE) Services

- **Information & Assistance**
Information and counseling to assess needs and connect people with needed services and supports. A total of 8,536 telephone callers were assisted during FY 2010.
- **State Health Insurance Program**
Assist with Medicare and other health related insurance.
- **Intake for Home and Community Based Services**
Telephone screening and in-home assessment visits to assess eligibility and facilitate access to home and community based services (HCBS) for the CHOICES program, Options for Community Living and the Family Caregiver Support program.
- **Service Coordination**
Service Coordinators assess the consumer's needs, develops a plan of care, monitors service delivery, advocates for the consumer, and assists the consumer in accessing other needed services.

Public Guardianship Program for the Elderly

This program serve persons 60 years of age who, due to physical or mental limitation, are unable to meet essential requirements of their physical health or to manage essential financial responsibilities, and have no family member, friend or corporation willing and/or able to act on their behalf. Persons are assigned to this program by the courts.

Medication Management

GNRC provides education and outreach in the community for older adults regarding management of medications. During FY2010, GNRC partnered with the UT College of Pharmacy and local pharmacists to hold eight events throughout the region. Attendees were given information about Medicare Part D and Medication Therapy Management (MTM) services, and they were trained on the use of the Universal Medication list and how to use the Poison Control Center.

SERVICES PROVIDED THROUGH CONTRACT

The AAAD contracted with sixty-one local agencies/organizations for the provision of senior center, nutrition, transportation, ombudsman, legal, and home and community based services. See detail of services/expenditures for each county in this report.

SPECIAL PROJECTS/HIGHLIGHTS

Diabetes Demonstration Project

GNRC was selected as one of seven sites across the nation to participate in a diabetes demonstration project through a partnership with the National Association of Area Agencies on Aging (N4A) and Healthways (headquartered in Franklin, TN). This study allowed Healthways to test the effects of a physical activity program specifically designed for seniors who have been diagnosed with Type II Diabetes.

Healthways customized a 12-week fitness program geared toward seniors with diabetes. Healthways reported that 2/3 of the demonstration project participants felt their health was much better or somewhat better at the conclusion of the program. In the Greater Nashville program, 11 participants completed the program. Of those eleven persons, nine lost weight ranging from one to eighteen pounds.

At the N4A conference in Saint Louis, GNRC AAAD was presented an award by N4A for participation in this project. In preparation for the Southeastern Association of Area Agencies on Aging (SE4A) Annual Aging Conference, GNRC nominated Healthways for the 2010 SE4A Corporate Partnership Award. Healthways was selected and will receive this award at the Awards Luncheon at the SE4A conference in Louisville, KY on September 27th.

Fall Prevention

In FY2010, GNRC implemented an evidence based program for fall prevention for seniors entitled *A Matter of Balance*. This program emphasizes practical strategies to reduce the fear of falling and increase activity levels. *A Matter of Balance* includes eight two-hour sessions for a small group led by a trained facilitator. This program was offered in three Senior Centers in the region, St. Clair Center in Murfreesboro, Mt. Juliet-West Wilson Senior Citizens Center, and Byrum-Porter Senior Center. One of the biggest impacts of the program was helping participants to understand the importance of staying active, to be cognizant of their surroundings, and to employ their communication skills in requesting assistance with mobility issues. This program will continue to be offered in FY2011.

CHOICES Implementation

Home and Community Based Services (HCBS) provided under the Statewide HCBS Medicaid Waiver program were transitioned to CHOICES in the Greater Nashville region March 1, 2010. CHOICES in Long-Term Care is TennCare's program for long-term care services. The CHOICES program offers more home-based options for meeting the long-term care needs of the state's elderly and adults with physical disabilities, reducing reliance on more costly nursing facility care.

Flood 2010

GNRC offices were closed for two days due to the historical May flooding which included the downtown Nashville area. GNRC implemented the GNRC Disaster Preparedness Plan and supervisors were able to communicate with staff to keep everyone updated on the status of the office. Various staff members of the AAAD spent many hours volunteering to assist in the recovery effort of seniors affected by the flood. As a part of the recovery effort the AAAD applied for and received a \$2,000 grant from the SE4A Disaster Relief Fund. These funds were used to create a disaster relief packet consisting of face masks, gloves, insect spray, trash bags, and other useful items that could be used by families in their clean up efforts. As a result of the outstanding work during and after the flood, a local volunteer organization, Hands on Nashville, was nominated by GNRC AAAD for special recognition. That award will be presented during the SE4A Annual Conference in Louisville, KY in September 2010.

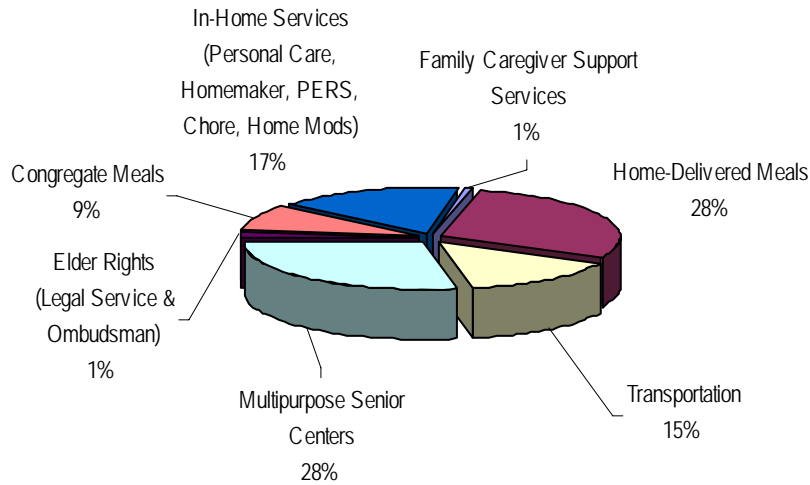
